



Loop route between villages and ridges for lovers of uphill. Postcard landscapes and a 360° view of the spectacular peaks of the Tuscan-Romagna Apennines. Starting from Castrocaro, take state road 67 and, after passing Dovadola, after 3 km turn right towards Modigliana, following a fairly demanding 6 km climb until reaching the top of Mount Trebbio, famous for its monument to the cyclist. A long descent leads us to Modigliana and turning left we proceed to Tredozio. From here, always on the left, we take another long climb (6 km) that brings us to Monte Busca. The next descent brings us first to Portico and then to Rocca S. Casciano. Another difficult climb (8.4 km), especially in the initial part, leads us to Monte Colombo. We continue downhill until Predappio then in San Lorenzo in Noceto we turn left to face the last



short climb that brings us to the top of the Volture. The view of the town of Castrocaro and the beautiful descent into the valley repays us for the effort made along the way.

We recommend a stop at the volcano of Mount Busca, the smallest volcano in Italy

The route has a couple of challenging points in the ascent to Mount Busca and Mount Colombo, all repaid by the magnificent view of the top of the mountain.
